The Scouts will compete with other troops while being tested on their Scout skills and ability to work as teams. The Scouts will spend Saturday competing in 5 of the 10 events as patrols. They will need to survive and be prepared as a team to complete each challenging event. They will be judged on many factors beyond the ability to complete the tasks. In the late afternoon there will be a troop level relay event. On Sunday there will be troop activities and merit badges offered. Scouts will pack their gear in duffels for transport. Bring a sack meal for the boat ride over. The boat Galley will be open for snacks on the way over. We will sleep in cabin tents with bunks. Bring a sleeping pad, ground cover and sleeping bag. The boys will carry their own gear. Do not over pack. They should have their "Ten Essentials" with them readily available during the event rotations. A daypack/hydration pack is a great way to carry things they might need throughout the day. We will be eating in a Camp Mess Hall. No utensils or cooking gear needed.

Class B t-shirts and shorts or bathing suits for Saturday and Sunday events. Events involve water and kayaking etc.

We will be hiking and walking about the island. The ground is rough in areas. Proper boots or sturdy shoes are a must. Island weather is unpredictable. BE PREPARED
