- □ Sunglasses
- □ Large black plastic trash
- Mess Kit (utensils, bowl, mug, etc)
- □ Toothbrush & paste
- □ Sunscreen and Chapstick
- □ Soap and Comb
- □ Small towel bag
- □ Toilet paper
- □ Tote N Chip patch or card
- □ Firem'n Chit patch or card
- □ Shelter supplies, tarp, rope, etc.
- □ Extra gum
