

Troop 212, Horseback Riding Trip, Saturday, April 27th
Prado Equestrian Center, 16629 Johnson Ave, Chino

Cost: \$35 per person for one hour. \$55 per person for two hours. Please plan on giving the drivers some money for auto fuel as well.

Reservations: Please send John an e-mail by Wednesday indicating how many riders interested, one or two hours for the ride, driver availability info with seat belts capacity...limited horses available. We will custom design the morning schedule based on the number of reservations received by Wednesday.

Permission Slips: Please bring the standard Troop permission slip *and* a Prado Equestrian liability waiver (will be on the Troop 212 website) with you .

Departure: Saturday, April 27th at 8:00 AM – Church parking lot. Please arrive promptly before departure for circle up and vehicle loading.

Return: Saturday, April 27 by or before 12 noon - back at Church Parking Lot. The arrival time may be earlier, depending on the number of attendees.

After we depart the church, we will drive directly to the Prado Equestrian Center in Chino...there will be no stops along the way. Please make sure you have a good breakfast

We will need drivers, so adults actually riding a horse is optional.

All Scouts and adults need to wear long pants (no shorts!). Class B uniform is suggested, but not required...however, those in B's get extra points on the Rating Chart. We will NOT be wearing class A uniforms on this trip.

The first ride begins at 9 AM and will last one hour. There may be a second ride, if we have enough riders interested...OR we may have one very long two hour ride.

As a minimum, the following items should be worn and carried by each scout:

- Appropriate Clothing (Morning mid-50 degrees)
- Long Pants (No Shorts!)
- Wide Brim Hat or Baseball-style Cap
- No open-toed shoes
- Sunglasses
- Sunscreen and Chapstick

Participants will be riding in small groups to explore the trails after a short warm up ride in the ring. Group size will be determined by the number of adults actually riding to lead the groups, and how many riders want a one hour ride or a two hour ride.
