

Mammoth Family Camp, June 20-21-22, 2025

Dear Scouts, Scouters, Parents, and Friends of the Troop,

This trip letter is for the Annual Mammoth Family Camp Event. We will be camping at the June Lake Campground, Gull Loop section, and Bear section (see attachment for site information) , for the full weekend. As you can see, sites have been assigned to families already. If we have accidentally skipped anybody, please let me know right away. We will not be camping Patrol Style. This trip camping arrangements will be Family Style based, so each scout will be staying with their family. Scouts that want to join in the adventure, may still attend if they do not have their families coming along. In these cases, scouts will be assigned to one of the other families

Important items to remember:

- **The money and permission slips for this trip will be collected on Monday, June 9th, during the troop meeting.**
- All meals will be group feed style. We will need help with meal prep, cooking and clean up.
- Please specify if you want chicken or fish for Saturday supper for everyone in your group during money collection. (Fish choice is assuming we have caught enough. Otherwise you get chicken as well, by default)
- Pack your fishing gear for rough transport.
- Some troop owned fishing rods are available for use but quantities are limited. Please borrow them from our Troop Quartermaster by or before June 9th. Tackle/bait is NOT provided by the troop.
- Taking part in fishing activities is not a requirement to attend this trip. The attendees may relax at base camp, hike local trails, lake Kayak/Canoe, or enjoy the area in any other safe manner.
- Boats may be rented from the local marinas at the participants own expense. Please check in with the marinas in advance.
- Class A uniform will be worn during auto travel to and from Mammoth on Friday and Sunday.
- Adults and youth that are 16 years or older are required to have their own fishing license.
- A one or two day license may be purchased instead of a full year.
- Purchase your license, salmon eggs/bait and tackle BEFORE the trip.
- Weather temps could be as high as 80° and lows down in the mid 30's due to left over snow in the region. Prepare accordingly.
- We will be camping in bear country, any and all food and smellable need to be put into the bear boxes every night. Be Bear Aware.
- Pets are allowed, and must be leashed at all time, but bring them at your own risk.
- We suggest everyone have a folding chair for meal and campfire use. We have observed the version that has a side folding table to be most useful.
- We have troop tents available for families to borrow on this trip....no need to buy a tent for just this trip.
- We need a few volunteer families with some vehicle space, to load some firewood for the Saturday night troop campfire..

Agenda:

Officially, The group will meet at 6 AM, Friday the 20st, quietly, at the Church parking lot , respecting the neighbors, and arrive at the Campground just about mid-day. Please be prompt. Those who come late will only penalize everyone that hopes to get some fishing in Friday afternoon. Travel time is roughly 6 hours. All participants will need to have had breakfast prior to departure. Everyone must also bring a bag lunch with drink for lunch Friday at camp. We suggest you bring some afternoon snacks as well, since supper will be a bit later than usual to allow for adequate fishing opportunities. Most families are leaving days earlier. This group departure are for those of us that can get only one day off.

This Friday schedule will give us plenty of daylight left for camp set up, and once that is finished, we are free to do what we want.. The fish really start biting about 2 hours before the sun goes down, so you should have plenty of time to get some good fishing in before supper on Friday, served at 7pm. Any fish caught Friday, will not be cooked for supper Friday, but instead held over for Saturday.

If anyone wants to depart Lakewood on their own later Friday morning, and arrive later at Camp as well, this is ok to do, but please let us know so we are not waiting for you in the church parking lot.

Those wishing to fish on Saturday will be split to event groups during a mandatory Friday evening, 8:30 PM, planning meeting immediately after Friday's supper, based on the type of fishing they want to do, and where they want to go. Anyone staying at camp for lunch needs to let us know at this same planning meeting. The plan Friday night, is to pre-distribute our Saturday lunch materials in order to facilitate a very early Saturday morning start. All people fishing need to bring their own fish transport coolers.

Breakfast Saturday morning will be a speedy continental serve yourself version from 5:30 AM to 7:30 AM to facilitate the fishing teams. At 7:30 AM the formal, usual scrambled eggs breakfast will begin preparation.

Supper Saturday will be a fish fry, assuming of course, the fishing teams have been successful. All fish must be cleaned before coming back to camp. The fish need to be in the kitchen no later than 4:30pm if you want them prepped for supper. PLEASE NOTE, fish cleaning is not allowed at the Campground. The target serving time for supper is 6:30 PM

To begin supper Saturday, we need volunteers to report in to the kitchen at 3:30 PM

4:00pm – Chicken prep begins

4:30pm – Fish prep begins, chicken needs to go on BBQ

5:30pm – Fish needs to go on BBQ

6:30pm – Serve supper

7:30pm – Clean up

8:30pm – Campfire and self-served desert bar.

Our targeted return on Sunday, June 22, is estimated at 6:00 PM, at the Church parking lot assuming an on time 11 AM departure from Mammoth. We will need all hands to assist with the troop gear packing to achieve this Sunday schedule. Our stop for lunch, at a location TBD, will not be provided by the troop.

Cost to cover fees for Camp Ground, Feeding(25), Storage(10), Troop Trailer Towing(5)

Base Price to cover one family with one tent site, and one vehicle site, (Occupying up to ½ campsite) is \$20 per family per night. Then add \$45 per person for troop provided food/supplies/ice for 5 Meals (Fri Sup, three Sat meals, Sun Br) and other operating fees.

Examples;

- One family of 2, using a tent, and one vehicle, that travels with the Troop Friday morning, staying two nights, would be \$40+\$90=\$130
- One family of 3, using a tent, and one vehicle, that travels with the Troop Friday morning, staying two nights, would be \$40+\$135=\$175

Extended Price to cover one family with one trailer site, and one vehicle, (Occupying 1 full campsite) is \$40 per family per night. Then add \$45 per person for troop provided food/supplies/ice for 5 Meals (Fri Sup, Sat Br, Sat Lu, Sat Su, Sun Br) and other fees.

There is nothing collected for fuel used during travel. Carpooling is encouraged, so each passenger should take care of their sponsoring driver.

I understand that participation in Scouting activities involves the risk of personal injury, including death, due to the physical, mental, and emotional challenges in the activities offered. I also understand that participation in these activities are entirely voluntary and requires participants to follow instructions and abide by all applicable rules for safety and the standards of conduct.

I have carefully considered the risk involved and hereby give my informed consent for my child to participate in all activities offered in the activity listed above, which also include food shopping meetings, equipment distribution meetings, and additional training meetings related to this activity.

In case of an emergency involving me or my child, I understand that efforts will be made to contact the individual listed as the emergency contact person by the medical provider and/or adult leader. In the event this person cannot be reached, permission is hereby given to the medical provider selected by the adult leader in charge to secure proper treatment, including hospitalization, anesthesia, surgery, or injections of medication for me or my child.

Medical providers are authorized to disclose protected health information to the adult in charge, camp medical staff, camp management, and/or any physician or health-care provider involved in providing medical care to the participant. Protected Health Information/Confidential Health Information (PHI/CHI) under the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information, 45 C.F.R. §§160.103, 164.501, etc. seq., as amended from time to time, includes examination findings, test results, and treatment provided for purposes of medical evaluation of the participant, follow-up and communication with the participant's parents or guardian, and/or determination of the participant's ability to continue in the program activities.

My Scout and I have reviewed his equipment checklist in his scout handbook and the trip letter for this event, and I am satisfied he is properly dressed and equipped for this activity. I understand that all troop activities are conducted in the spirit of the Scout Oath and Law. Any Scout, in the opinion of the adult leadership, that does not live up to these principles may be required to call his parents and have them bring him home.

In consideration of the current COVID environment, I understand and agree to not send my child to any Troop 212 event if my child is exhibiting illness symptoms, (having "just a cold" counts as exhibiting illness) or tested positive with a home test kit, or that any time during my child's stay with any Troop 212 Program, I may be called on to transport my family member (youth or adult) from program for medical reasons. I commit to being available for the duration of the event by phone should I need to be contacted by the troop leadership. Furthermore, upon consultation with the troop leadership I agree to pick up my participating scout within a reasonably short time after being contacted, to be determined and agreed upon during this contact call. I will also provide a second level contact to be prepared for unforeseen circumstances.

I further authorize the sharing of the information on this form with any BSA volunteers or professionals who need to know of medical conditions that may require special consideration in conducting Scouting activities.

With appreciation of the dangers and risks associated with programs and activities, on my own behalf and/or on behalf of my child, I hereby fully and completely release and waive any and all claims for personal injury, death, or loss that may arise against the Boy Scouts of America, the local council, the activity coordinators, and all employees, volunteers, related parties, or other organizations associated with any program or activity.
